Graduate Bulletin Information

The University of Denver Graduate Bulletin outlines GSSW program requirements. The advising and academic planning information in this guide is based on the [University of Denver Graduate Bulletin](#), specific to the academic year in which students are admitted.

Students complete the requirements for the **Advanced Social Work Practice** degree program to earn the Master of Social Work

Section 1: Degree Requirements

(MSW) degree. This program prepares students with theoretical knowledge, applied skills, and values to work across a continuum of services at individual, family, group, organization, and community systems levels — preparing graduates to practice with a wide range of populations and settings.

The curriculum emphasizes culturally responsive practice. Faculty expertise anchors a curriculum encouraging students to focus their degree in alignment with specific areas of interest or career goals. Practice courses are taught by instructors actively involved in community engaged social work.

GSSW has structured the curriculum to meet the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) [2022 Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards \(EPAS\)](#). Social work competence is the ability to integrate and apply knowledge, values, skills, and cognitive and affective processes to practice situations in a culturally responsive, purposeful, and professional manner to promote human and community well-being.

The 9 competencies of professional social work practice:

- Competency 1: Demonstrate Ethical and Professional Behavior
- Competency 2: Advanced Human Rights and Social, Racial, Economic, and Environmental Justice
- Competency 3: Engage in Anti-Racism, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (ADEI) in Practice
- Competency 4: Engage in Practice-Informed Research and Research Informed Practice
- Competency 5: Engage in Policy Practice
- Competency 6: Engage with Individuals, Families, Groups, Organizations, and Communities
- Competency 7: Assess Individuals, Families, Groups, Organizations, and Communities
- Competency 8: Intervene with Individuals, Families, Groups, Organizations, and Communities
- Competency 9: Evaluate Practice with Individuals, Families, Groups, Organizations, and Communities

MSW students must complete a minimum of 81 credits. Advanced Standing MSW students (with an accredited BSW) must complete 54 credits.

Section 2: Pathway Information

Creating a Career Pathway for your degree plan helps you focus your curriculum toward an area of practice, population, or social work setting that aligns with your career interests.

Pathway FAQs

Q: How do I use the Career Pathway option?

A: You may create a curriculum plan based on a variety of interests across each requirement area or focus your curriculum toward a specific area of practice or population. You have flexibility in the choices you make to earn your degree.

Q: Do I need to follow career pathway course recommendations exactly?

A: **No. Career Pathways are suggestions.** If a suggested class is unavailable, or if another course interests you more, you may choose any course in that category to fulfill degree requirements.

Q: What if I want a specific license after my MSW?

A: Consult the state licensing board for your area, such as LSW, LCSW, CAC, or School Social Worker licensure. Visit the Licensure page in the MSW Student Resource Portal and contact GSSW Career Services. Some states have specific course requirements to consider in your plan.

Q: What if my preferred courses are mostly in Electives?

A: Connect with a faculty academic advisor at [Advising – Ways to Connect](#). Advisors can help align your interests with required offerings. We are unable to substitute electives for required courses, but advisors can assist you in identifying courses that may align well with your interests.

Q: What if I want a certificate, dual degree or scholarship?

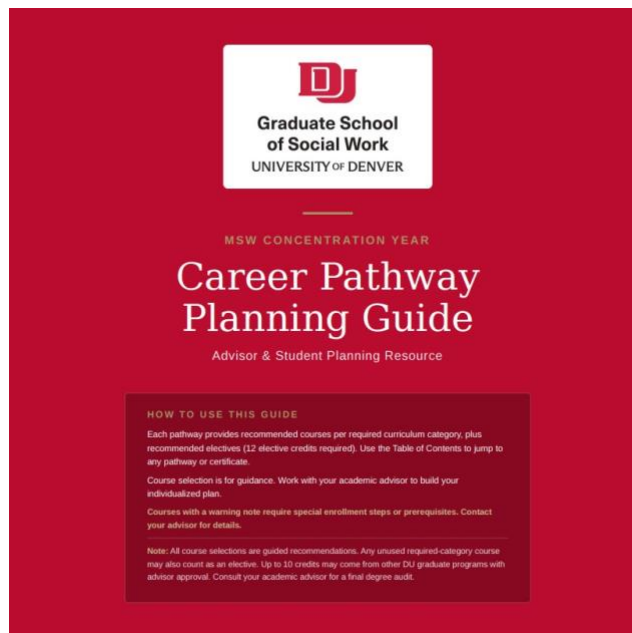
A: Review certificate, dual degree, and scholarship requirements on the MSW Student Resource Portal. There are specific course, field, and credit requirements for these programs. Meet with an advisor and the appropriate program coordinators to support your decision-making.

Q: What if I want to take a class within another GSSW program?

A: Denver Campus students may take cross-listed classes and up to 10 credits in the MSW@Denver program, the Western Colorado program, or other DU graduate-level courses with advisor and instructor approval. These non-GSSW courses must be graduate-level courses and will be considered electives.
